Also having bi-weekly meetings leading up to the eventual approval of funding were held.

The Mays launched Pittsburgh's first off-leash dog bar — a unique fusion of a dog park and a bar. Spanning nearly 7,000 square feet of indoor and outdoor space, the venue offers a safe, social environment for dogs and a relaxing, community-driven atmosphere for their humans.
